

Charalambos P Kyriacou, is Professor of Behavioural Genetics at the Department of Genetics & Genome Biology at Leicester University, UK. His first degree is in Psychology, but he moved into fly behavioural genetics for his PhD before embarking on postdoctoral work with Jeffrey Hall at Brandeis University in 1978. There he initiated work with *period* mutants on fly behaviour and he continued this collaboration with Hall, and then Michael Rosbash, for the next two decades. He returned to the UK and set up his lab first in Edinburgh and then moved to Leicester in 1984. He has continued to work with clocks, ultradian, circatidal, circadian, and seasonal, on a variety of model and non-model organisms. His work and that of his main collaborators encompasses evolutionary and ecological approaches, 'omics' studies and neurogenetics.
